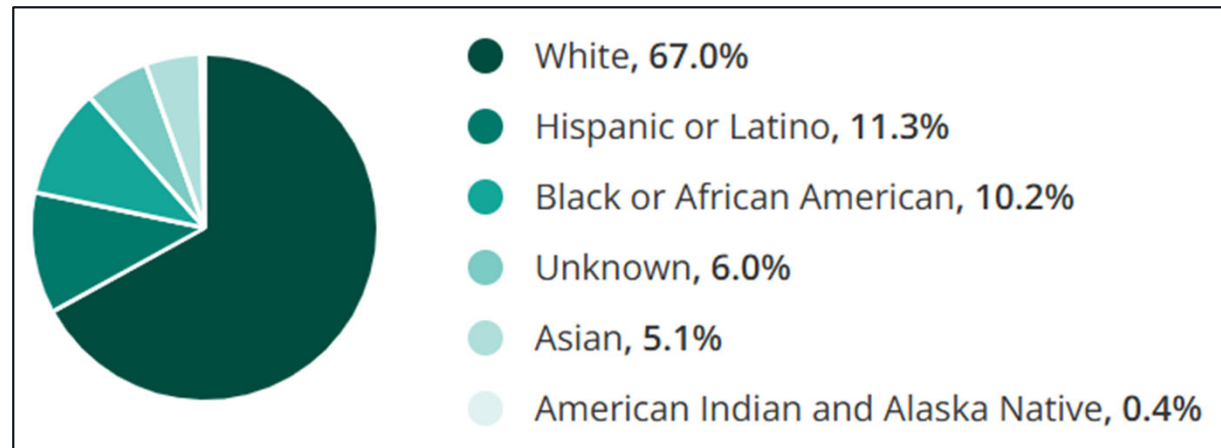
Why Bias?

AI reflects the people and the systems that build and train it.

Awareness to Action

Procurement

Questions for AI software vendors:

- Where does the training data come from?
- Was the tool audited for bias? By whom? How often?
- How do you allow humans to intervene if something is harmful or inaccurate?

If a vendor can't answer basic transparency questions, that's a red flag.

Awareness to Action

Governance

Keep humans involved in decisions that affect people. Governance practices can include:

- Human-in-the-loop review for decisions (e.g., eligibility screening)
- Internal oversight team or ethics advisor
- Clear chain for escalation when a system gets something wrong
- Transparent communication - letting people know when AI is involved

Awareness to Action

Community

Design and test tools with the people they impact.

Nonprofits can bring lived experience into the design and evaluation process, early and often:

- Focus groups before adopting tools
- Pilots with feedback loops
- Community members on advisory panels
- Calling out harms when they emerge
